

Goals, Objectives, Strategies, Indicators

- **Goal 1:** Empower older adults, their families, and other consumers to make informed decisions and to easily access existing health and long-term care options.
 - **Objective 1.1:** Educate the public on the availability of services to foster independence, self-sufficiency, and their future planning for long-term needs.
 - **Strategy 10:** Expand public awareness of driver safety resources and promote safe driving.
 - **Performance Measure (Indicator) 1.1.10:** DAAS will partner with other members of the NC Senior Driver Safety Coalition to post online resources for the general public promoting safe driving (ongoing target date).

This is an example of a goal and some of its related objective, strategies, and performance measures from the State Aging Services Plan after which we are modeling.

Look at handout, you will see the definition of each of these items. We are aligning our objectives within the eight state goals (bolded ones seem most relevant to our group), but we are developing our own objectives, strategies, and indicators.

Goal's for Today's Meeting

1. Think critically about each solution to assist with the next step of ranking them.
 2. **Change the wording of solutions as necessary**
 3. **Combine or rearrange solutions where appropriate.**
 4. Delete solutions if group agrees.
- Keep in mind: Focus on useful *strategies* to include in the Department on Aging's MAP

Right now we have a lot of solutions, some of which are pretty specific. One of our main tasks today will be to find ways to combine our solutions into unified strategies, or actions that the OCDOA can do in the next five years.

Remember that some of the specific items can be included as examples of activities or indicators that the department might take on pertaining to a given strategy.

In our past meetings we've encouraged unlimited brainstorming, but we're now at the stage where we have to be more realistic about what the Department on Aging and the county can achieve in the next five years.
