## NORTH CAROLINA

County Manager Bonnie Hammersley serves as the chief administrator of Orange County. She is appointed by and serves under the direction of the Board of County Commissioners (BOCC).

The Manager supervises and coordinates the activities of the County's 23 departments for the BOCC, ensuring that all decisions, policies, and programs are implemented. The Manager also works to ensure that federal and State laws as well as guidelines mandated to county government are implemented.

Orange County is governed by a seven-member board of commissioners, elected by district and at-large in partisan countywide elections.

Commissioners serve four year terms and elections are held in November of even numbered years. New board members take office at the first meeting in December following the November election. At this meeting, new and re-elected Board members take the oath of office and elect a Chair and Vice Chair for the coming year.

The primary duties of the Board include adopting an annual budget, establishing the annual property tax rate, appointing various officials and representatives to advisory boards and commissions, planning for County needs, and enacting local ordinances. The Board also has the authority to call bond referenda, enter into contracts, and establish new programs and departments.

The Board of Commissioners meets regularly at 7:00 p.m., usually on the first and third Tuesdays of the month.



The Sheriff is an elected official, who fills a variety of important law enforcement and administrative duties in our community. Deputies are sworn law enforcement personnel, appointed by the Sheriff as an extension of him/herself, to help uphold the law, preserve the peace, and carry out the many duties assigned to the Sheriff. The Sheriff is elected for a term of four years. The Sheriff and his staff are available to all residents in the county, whether in the rural areas or a municipality with its own police department, mainly concentrating law enforcement efforts in the areas not inside the municipalities. The Sheriff and his deputies have the authority to arrest for any violation of the law and are the only law enforcement officers in a given county with authority to serve Civil Process.

The administrative office serves the following functions: Customer Service, Landfill Accounts, Annual Fee Administration, Regulated Recyclable Material Ordinance Permits and Licensing, Refuse and Recycling Design Guidelines, Education and Outreach, Financing and Budgeting, Program Performance (statistics), and Environmental Enforcement (Illegal Dumping and Burning).

The Tax Office consists of three divisions: Land Records/GIS, Tax Assessment, and Revenue & Collections. Land Records/GIS maintains property information used in public inquiry and legal research and uses public documents to create and maintain the official index of property ownership in the County. Tax Assessment is responsible for identifying, reporting and assigning a value to taxable property to ensure equitable taxation across the County. Revenue & Collections supervises the timely collection and disposition of taxes within the County as well as collects ambulance billing, issues business licenses for beer/wine and massage, and issues mobile home moving permits.

## **ADULT CARE HOME COMMUNITY ADVISORY COMMITTEE**

This committee works to maintain the intent of the Adult Care Home Residents' Bill of Rights for those residing in licensed adult care homes. The members of this committee also promote community involvement and cooperation with these homes to ensure quality care for older and disabled adults.

## **ADVISORY BOARD ON AGING**

This board suggests policy and makes recommendations to the Board of Commissioners and the Department on Aging while acting as the liaison between the older adults of the County and the County government.

## **AFFORDABLE HOUSING ADVISORY BOARD**

The Board will explore new funding opportunities, assist in the investigation of County residential segregation patterns, and assist with other housing-related items as identified by the Board of County Commissioners.

## **AGRICULTURAL PRESERVATION BOARD**

This board seeks to encourage the voluntary preservation of farmland from non-farm development, recognizing the importance of agriculture to the economic and cultural life of the county. It administers the County's Voluntary Farmland Protection Program ordinance and advises the Board of Commissioners on a wide range of agricultural topics.

## **ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE CONTROL BOARD**

The ABC Board has the authority to buy, sell, transport and possess alcoholic beverages for the operation of its stores. This board also adopts rules for the ABC system and has the authority to hire and dismiss employees.

## **ANIMAL SERVICES ADVISORY BOARD**

The Animal Services Advisory Board is charged to advise the Board of County Commissioners on matters of concern regarding animal issues and services within the county, and to work with Animal Services on various policy concerns and issues. The board also hears appeal cases involving Potentially Dangerous Dog Declarations within the county.

## **ARTS COMMISSION**

The arts commission recommends strategies to promote the artistic and cultural growth of Orange County, advises the Board of Commissioners on matters involving the arts, and acts as the granting panel for two annual funding programs available to individual artists and non-profit groups sponsoring arts projects in Orange County.

## **BOARD OF HEALTH**

The Board of Commissioners appoints representatives of specific health-related professions and the general public to this board. It makes policy and is charged with protecting and promoting the public health in Orange County.

## **BOARD OF SOCIAL SERVICES**

The board is charged with selecting the Director of Social Services and advising the County and municipalities in ways to improve the social conditions of the community.

## **COMMISSION FOR THE ENVIRONMENT**

This commission advises the Board of Commissioners on matters affecting the environment with particular emphasis on protection. It educates public and local officials on environmental issues and performs special studies and projects.



## **EQUALIZATION AND REVIEW BOARD**

The board examines and reviews the tax lists of the County for the current year to ensure that all taxable property is listed on the County's abstracts and tax records and appraised according to the standards required by the General Statutes.

## **HISTORIC PRESERVATION COMMISSION**

This commission is charged with the identification, inventory and protection of architectural and archaeological sites in the County, with publishing and/or offering online records of this inventory, and advising the Board of County Commissioners on matters pertaining to historic preservation.

## **HUMAN RELATIONS COMMISSION**

This commission seeks to prevent and/or eliminate bias and discrimination by means of education, persuasion, conciliation and enforcement. It also advises the Board of County Commissioners on these matters, receives discrimination complaints, and conducts the corresponding investigation of such complaints.

## **JURY COMMISSION**

This commission reviews the list of potential jurors and prepares the jury list.

## **NURSING HOME COMMUNITY ADVISORY COMMITTEE**

This committee helps to maintain the intent of the Residents' Bill of Rights, promotes community involvement and provides public education on long-term care issues. The regional ombudsman with Triangle J Council of Governments provides specialized training and support.

## **OPC OVERSIGHT BOARD**

Local advisory boards will be responsible for advising the Regional Executive on the evaluation and hiring of the Community Operations Center Executive Director; recommending priorities for expenditure of state/county funds for development of the annual budget; determining local priorities for inclusion in the area-wide strategic plan, and other advising duties.

## **ORANGE COUNTY BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT**

The Board of Adjustments hears and decides on variance applications, appeals submitted related to official decisions/determinations made by the Planning Director, reviews and takes action on Class B Special Use Permit applications, as well as matters required to pass by the Unified Development Ordinance.

## **ORANGE COUNTY BOARD OF HEALTH**

The Board of Health is the primary policy-making and adjudicatory body for the Health Department. They are charged with protecting and promoting public health in Orange County. The Board is mandated by state law and is composed of professionals representing specified health related fields in addition to several at-large members.

## **ORANGE COUNTY HOUSING AUTHORITY**

The goal of the Orange County Housing Authority board is to provide decent, safe, and sanitary housing for the low and moderate income families in the County.

## **ORANGE COUNTY PLANNING BOARD**

This board studies Orange County and surrounding areas to determine objectives in the development of the County. It prepares and recommends plans to achieve that development, including the suggesting of policies, ordinances, and procedures. It reviews development applications and makes recommendations to the Board of Commissioners.


## **ORANGE UNIFIED TRANSPORTATION BOARD**


## **SOLID WASTE ADVISORY GROUP**
