PURPOSE: To provide notice of the Board of County Commissioners' plans to hold a public hearing on February 16, 2010 on potential items for inclusion in Orange County's legislative agenda package for the 2010 North Carolina General Assembly Session.

BACKGROUND: The Board of County Commissioners is asked to schedule a public hearing during its regular meeting on Tuesday, February 16, 2010 at 7:00 p.m. at the Southern Human Services Center at 2501 Homestead Road in Chapel Hill, North Carolina. The purpose of the public hearing will be to receive public comments on potential items for inclusion in Orange County's legislative agenda package for the 2010 North Carolina General Assembly Session.

The County's Legislative Issues Work Group consisting of Commissioner Valerie Foushee, Commissioner Barry Jacobs, and County staff is reviewing items for possible inclusion in Orange County's legislative package. Information on the proposed items will be provided to the BOCC and others prior to the February 16 meeting.

It should also be noted that the Clerk to the Board has scheduled a joint legislative breakfast for the BOCC and Orange County's legislative delegation for February 22, 2010.
