Project Description:

Most County buildings are now equipped with fire alarm systems. This project would see remaining buildings up-fitted with fire alarm systems, and improvements to the existing system at the Historic Courthouse. Also included are improvements to modernize the elevator at the Historic Courthouse, and installation of automated access doors at West Campus Office Building, and the Seymour Senior Center. The \$190,000 funds requested in FY16-17 are for accessibility and security improvements as identified by the Space Study Work Group, Emergency Action Planning Work Group, and the Facility Accessibility Self Assessment. Future funding will include remaining buildings to upgrade fire alarm systems, and improvements to the existing systems.
