RESOLUTION of ADOPTION  
ORANGE COUNTY  
HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN UPDATE

WHEREAS, the North Carolina General Assembly passed Senate Bill 300 "*An Act to Amend the Laws Regarding Emergency Management as Recommended by the Legislative Disaster Response Commission*" in June of 2001 that among other provisions requires local governments to have a hazard mitigation plan approved in order to receive state public assistance funds; and

WHEREAS, in October of 2000 the President of the United States signed into law the "*Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000*" (PL 106-390) to amend the "*Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Act of 1988*" which among other provisions requires local governments to adopt a mitigation plan in order to be eligible for hazard mitigation funding; and

WHEREAS, Federal mitigation planning regulations require Local Mitigation Plans to be updated and resubmitted to the Federal Emergency Management Agency for approval every five years in order to continue eligibility for Federal Emergency Management Agency hazard mitigation assistance programs; and

WHEREAS, the North Carolina Division of Emergency Management is assisting local governments in the update of hazard mitigation plans; and

WHEREAS, the Orange County Planning and Emergency Services Departments and representatives from the Towns of Carrboro and Hillsborough have performed a comprehensive review and evaluation of each section of the previously approved Hazard Mitigation Plan and have updated the plan as required under regulations at 44 CFR Part 201 and according to guidance issued by the Federal Emergency Management Agency and the North Carolina Division of Emergency Management; and

WHEREAS, the North Carolina Division of Emergency Management has deemed the Orange County Hazard Mitigation Plan Update compliant with Section 322 of the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 as well as with relevant state requirements; and

WHEREAS, the Federal Emergency Management Agency has issued an approval of the Orange County Hazard Mitigation Plan Update, subject to formal community adoption;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Commissioners of Orange County hereby adopt, by way of this resolution, the "*Orange County Hazard Mitigation Plan Update*" as approved by the Federal Emergency Management Agency.

WHEREAS, the North Carolina General Assembly passed Senate Bill 300 "*An Act to Amend the Laws Regarding Emergency Management as Recommended by the Legislative Disaster Response Commission*" in June of 2001 that among other provisions requires local governments to have a hazard mitigation plan approved prior to November 1, 2004 in order to receive state public assistance funds;

WHEREAS, in October of 2000 the President of the United States signed into law the "*Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000*" (PL 106-390) to amend the "*Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Act of 1988*" which among other provisions requires local governments to adopt a mitigation plan in order to be eligible for hazard mitigation funding;

WHEREAS, the North Carolina Division of Emergency Management is assisting local governments in the formulation of hazard mitigation plans;

WHEREAS, the North Carolina Division of Emergency Management has established rules and criteria that allow municipalities to adopt their county's approved hazard mitigation plan through resolution;

WHEREAS, the Town of Hillsborough has worked closely with the Orange County Hazard Mitigation Planning Team to develop a county-wide hazard mitigation plan that will serve the needs of Hillsborough Citizens;

WHEREAS, the Town of Hillsborough supports Hazard Mitigation Planning as a logical means toward protecting people and property from the potential devastating effects of natural hazards;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Hillsborough Board of Commissioners:

1. Desire to participate with Orange County in planning for the mitigation of effects caused by natural hazards;
2. Assign staff representation as determined by the Town Manager to work as a member of the Orange County Hazard Mitigation Planning Team to implement and update hazard mitigation planning activities;
3. Adopt, by way of this resolution, the March 16, 2010 Updated version of the "*Orange County Hazard Mitigation Plan*" as approved by the North Carolina Division of Emergency Management and The Federal Emergency Management Agency.

The following resolution was introduced by Alderman Dan Coleman and duly seconded by Alderman Randee Haven-O'Donnell.

**A RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE 2010 UPDATE OF THE  
ORANGE COUNTY HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN  
Resolution No. 176/2009-10**

WHEREAS, the President of the United States signed into law the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 (PL 106-390) in October 2000, amending the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Act of 1988, which among other provisions requires local governments to adopt a mitigation plan in order to be eligible for hazard mitigation funding; and

WHEREAS, the North Carolina General Assembly passed Senate Bill 300 in June of 2001 that among other provisions required local governments to approve a hazard mitigation plan before August 1, 2002 in order to receive state public assistance funds; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Carrboro, with Orange County and the Town of Hillsborough, developed and adopted an Orange County Hazard Mitigation Plan in May 2004; and

WHEREAS, Federal mitigation planning regulations require local mitigation plans to be updated and resubmitted to FEMA every five years in order to maintain eligibility for hazard mitigation assistance programs; and

WHEREAS, the North Carolina Division of Emergency Management has provided assistance in the process of updating local hazard mitigation plans; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Department of the Town of Carrboro, the Orange County Planning and Emergency Services Departments, and the Town of Hillsborough have worked closely together to complete a comprehensive review and evaluation of each section of the previously adopted Hazard Mitigation Plan and have updated the Plan as required by 44 CFR Part 201; and

WHEREAS, the draft plan has been reviewed and approved by the Federal Emergency Management Agency, pending adoption by each of the three local governments involved.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Carrboro:

1. Reaffirms its commitment to local hazard mitigation planning as a logical means of protecting people and property from the potential, devastating effects of natural hazards.
2. Adopts the 2010 update of the Orange County Hazard Mitigation Plan.
3. Requests that the State and Federal governments mitigate the catastrophic risk of a nuclear accident to the citizens of Carrboro and others by first not allowing any

expansion at the Shearon Harris Nuclear Power Plant, and ultimately, by ending the use of nuclear power.




