Volunteers, trained under a relationship-building mentorship model, provide customized assistance with the management of daily tasks such as homework and ESL tutoring, assisting with job applications, paying bills and completing paperwork, and other tasks as needed.</p> | <p>We work with high school refugee youth and young adults to facilitate leadership and empowerment through workshops, social events and educational programs often in partnership with other groups.
