Steve Yuhasz was born and raised in New Jersey. He received a B.S. in Mathematics from Virginia Commonwealth University in 1976 and his M.A. from Arizona State University in 1978. Steve then came to North Carolina to study Mathematics at UNC and has lived in Orange County ever since. While attending UNC he lived in Hillsborough, where he was also employed as a Land Surveyor. He became a Registered (now designated Professional) Land Surveyor in January, 1982. Steve founded ENT Land Surveys, Inc. in 1983, and his land surveying practice provided his initial involvement with county government. In 2000 he entered the North Carolina Central University Evening Law program, receiving his J.D. in May 2004. He was admitted to practice law in North Carolina in October, 2004 and has continued to manage ENT Land Surveys, Inc while operating his law practice.

Steve served on the Orange County Planning Board from 1984 to 1990 and the Orange County Economic Development Commission from 1992 to 1995. He is a member of the North Carolina Society of Surveyors and has served on its Board of Directors and as President of the local Chapter. Steve is a member of the Orange County Bar Association and the District 15-B Bar.

Elected to the Orange County Board of Commissioners in November 2008, Steve is currently serving his first term. He was Vice-Chair of the Board in 2011, and served on the Orange County Board of Health and as commissioner representative to the Orange-Person-Chatham Area Programs Board for Mental Health, the Solid Waste Advisory Board and the Durham-Chapel Hill-Orange joint work group. He has also provided commissioner representation to the Orange County Advisory Board on Aging, Healthy Carolinians, and the Information Technology Advisory Committee.
