January

- Innovation grants provided for internal pilot projects



- Smoke-Free Public Places Rule goes into effect



March

- New patient billing system implemented
- New brand and logo unveiled

April

- Breast and cervical cancer screening services added including:
 - Clinical breast exams
 - Mammograms
 - Pap Test
 - Diagnostic testing for abnormal results



May

- Measles outbreak in North Carolina with Orange County being one of top two hot spots
 - Confirmed cases in Orange County—8
 - Contacts followed—40 people
 - Devoted staff time—260 hours
 - Media outreach—46 stories + 13 social media posts
 - Awarded "Best Practice in an Outbreak Response" by NC Division of Public Health, Communicable Disease Branch



June

- Reaccredited by the North Carolina Local Health Department Accreditation Board


July

- Environmental Health Division assisted local businesses to facilitate clean-up and reopening after flooding
- Nurses provided care at the emergency shelter to families affected by the flood



September

- 40+ UNC Masters of Public Health students visited Hillsborough for annual Practice Pathways 'Phield' Trip to learn about public health



- Informatics initiatives to improve health through data use:
 - Partnerships with local school systems to identify gaps and prioritize health initiatives.
 - County population health dashboards that compare Orange to peer counties, state and national health indicators
 - Internal clinic management dashboards to improve revenue and patient experience.



October

- 18 certified enrollment specialists began helping people register in the Affordable Care Act Marketplace at both the Chapel Hill and Hillsborough clinic locations

November

- Medical and Dental Clinics transitioned to electronic medical records to:
 - Increase efficiency, accuracy, and access to data
 - Integrate patient information between both clinic locations
 - Save money, space, and paper
 - Be more environmentally friendly

December

- Became the first health department in North Carolina to dispense the life saving opioid overdose medication naloxone (Narcan)






