

### WHO QUALIFIES

All Orange County, North Carolina residents—both children and adults—can be seen at the Dental Clinic.

### COST & PAYMENT

The Dental Clinic operates on a fee-scale based on your income. The minimum fee is \$30 per visit.

Payment options include cash, check, Visa or MasterCard, Medicaid, Health Choice, or Private Dental Insurance

### INTERPRETERS ARE AVAILABLE & FREE OF CHARGE

If you need an interpreter or an assistive device, please tell the staff person helping you.

### COMMON QUESTIONS

- How often should I see the dentist?

A check-up every six months is recommended in order to prevent cavities and other dental problems.

- Why is it important to see a dentist every six months?

Preventive dentistry helps to keep your smile healthy. By visiting the dentist twice a year, he or she can check for problems that you may not see or feel. In many cases, dental problems don't cause you pain until they are more serious. Getting regular cleanings and check-ups helps to keep your teeth clean, healthy and pain free.

- When should I take my child to the dentist for their first check-up?

Your child should be seen by a dentist when their first tooth appears, or no later than his/her first birthday.
