### To REGISTER

Registrations are processed first-come, first-served.

If you or your family has participated with us before and you do not know your account information, call 919.245.2660 during regular business hours (Monday-Friday, 8:30 a.m.-4:30 p.m.) for further assistance.

Programs have registration deadlines, typically one week prior to the start of the program, to ensure appropriate supplies and preparation for program operation. Additionally, programs have minimum and maximum enrollments. Programs may be canceled if minimum not met; enrollment may close early if maximum is reached.

### CREDIT CARD USAGE FEE

Transactions are subject to a Credit Card Usage Fee equal to 3% of your total purchase, effective 7/1/2024. This fee will be applied to all online enrollments/reservations and phone payments, as well as any in-person transactions when payment is made by credit card.

### PROGRAM REFUND POLICY

If requested seven or more days prior to the first program date, a full refund less a \$5 administrative fee will be given. No administrative fee is charged if a household credit is accepted. No refund will be given if requested less than seven days before the first program date. Credit card fees are non-refundable.

Summer camps operate with a modified refund policy. See Summer Camp brochure and registration receipt for details.

# CHILDCARE SERVICES

## PRESCHOOL ACADEMY

Preschool Academy is the perfect in-person classroom for your little one. Our curriculum uses age-appropriate activities to teach students numbers, letters, colors, rhythm, and science. Based on the weekly theme, students will partake in a wide variety of activities each day. This program provides both academic enrichment and socialization opportunities. Snack is provided. Note that the classroom does have a television that may be used for limited academic instruction purposes (such as facilitating song and movement segment).

### Schedule

Enrollment is available part-time, 8:30 a.m.-12:30 p.m., either 2-days-per-week or 3-days-per-week. Participants can also choose to attend all 5 days, M-F, by registering their child for both sessions. Different activities will occur on each of the days.

Daily activities include starting the day with whole group circle time with a story selected based on the weekly theme. We then move on to structured learning activities which include focus on literacy, science, cooking, math, and art. Following those activities, we will move on to snack which can be provided or sent from home followed by free play on the playground. When we return to the classroom, students will have their choice of discovery centers such as sensory tables, building, library, and dramatic play.

### Registration

Priority registration is given to returning students. Month-to-month, enrolled students must confirm enrollment with payment by 5 p.m. on the 15th of each month (or first business day following in the event of weekend or holiday). At 5 p.m. any remaining spaces will be available for open enrollment online or in person with payment due at the time of enrollment.

Monthly fees will not be prorated for partial attendance, holidays, or other non-class days.

Registration is not confirmed and student may not begin attendance until a welcome notice is received in writing from Preschool Academy staff in order to ensure adequate supplies are prepared.

Enrolled participants must be potty-trained. Diapers or pull-ups are not acceptable in Preschool Academy.

## AFTER SCHOOL

The After School Program provides enrichment learning including physical activity and fitness, homework assistance, STEAM-based activities in the areas of science, engineering, art, music, and much more. The program operates from school dismissal until 5:30 p.m. Monday through Friday when school is in session. After School follows Orange County Schools Traditional Academic Calendar for Students.

### Transportation

After School serves students enrolled at Central, Grady Brown, New Hope, Pathways, and River Park Elementary schools. The program is located at the Central Recreation Center in downtown Hillsborough. Transportation from your child's school to the Central Recreation Center is provided via County-owned and -operated 15-passenger vans. Enrolled participants are to be picked up from the Central Recreation Center by 5:30 pm; transportation is not provided to home at the end of the program day.

### Schedule

Daily schedule will include physical activity, snack time, homework help or quiet, self-directed activity, theme/enrichment activity, and activity centers. Snack is provided.

### Registration

Priority registration is given to returning students. Month-to-month, enrolled students must confirm enrollment with payment by 5:00 p.m. on the 15th of each month (or first business day following in the event of weekend or holiday). At 5:00 p.m. any remaining spaces will be available for open enrollment online or in person with payment due at the time of enrollment.

Registration is not confirmed and student may not begin attendance until a welcome notice is received in writing from After School staff in order to ensure transportation arrangements are secured.

### Behavior Expectations

Every participant is expected to follow reasonable standards of appropriate behavior. We expect them to show camaraderie, good sportsmanship, and respect towards other participants and staff. Every participant is expected to respect the rights of others and can't take away from the enjoyment, safety, and participation of others. Participation in Orange County Recreation programs depends on their ability to cooperate in a group environment.

## SCHOOL'S OUT FUN DAY CAMP

Do you need a safe, nurturing, and fun place for your children to go when school is out? Orange County Recreation Division is offering an all-day care program on select dates for the 2025-2026 school year for children currently enrolled in Pre-K through 5th grade in any Orange County School. Children will spend their day playing games in our gymnasium and outdoor area, participating in enrichment activities in the areas of science, arts, cooking, and more.

Program will accept campers on a first-come, first-served basis until filled.

### Transportation

Transportation to and from camp is the responsibility of the parent. Select School's Out Fun Day Camps will include off-site field trips. Transportation for field trips is provided via County-owned and -operated 15-passenger vans. Booster seats are provided to children in accordance with North Carolina law.

### Behavior Expectations

Every participant is expected to follow reasonable standards of appropriate behavior. We expect them to show camaraderie, good sportsmanship, and respect towards other participants and staff. Every participant is expected to respect the rights of others and can't take away from the enjoyment, safety, and participation of others. ### REFUND POLICY

Fees are 100% refundable when the program is canceled by the Department.

If requested prior to Friday, May 1, a refund will be issued less a 20% processing fee per camp and/or extended care canceled. After close of business on May 1, no refunds will be issued.

Camps are non-transferable; a camp enrollment for one child cannot be given to another. Refund exceptions may be made with documentation for academic requirements or medical necessity.

### AGES

Camps will be offered for campers ages 3- to 14-years-old. Camps will be divided into four age groups: 3- to 5-year-olds, 6- to 8-year-olds, 9- to 11-year-olds and limited weeks of Field Trip Camps for 12- to 14-year-olds. Sports camps will be offered for campers ages 6- to 11-years-old with campers divided into age and skill appropriate groups during the week.

### LUNCH SUPERVISION

Campers enrolled in a full day of camp (two half-day camps in the same week) may participate in lunch supervision (12-1 p.m.). Lunch is not provided; campers must bring their own meals. Refrigerator and microwave are not available.




