TO REGISTER:

Registration is processed first-come, first-served. Payment is due in full at the time of registration.

Registration begins Monday, February 16 at 8:30 a.m.

Registration is accepted in person and online.

In-person registration is available at the Bonnie B. Davis Environment and Agricultural Center, Suite 140, 1020 US 70 West, Hillsborough. Registration will continue during regular business hours, Monday through Friday, 8:30 a.m.-11:45 a.m. and 1:15 p.m.-4:30 p.m.

Online registration is available at www.orangecountync.gov/ActivityRegistration. On Monday, February 16, registration will open at 8:30 a.m. Online registration is available 24/7. Phone support for online registration available at 919.245.2660 during regular business hours, Monday through Friday, 8:30 a.m.-11:45 a.m. and 1:15 p.m.-4:30 p.m.

REFUND POLICY:

Fees are 100% refundable when the program is canceled by the Department.

If requested prior to Friday, May 2, a refund will be issued less a 20% processing fee per camp canceled. After close of business on May 2, no refunds will be issued.

Camps are non-transferable; a registration for one child cannot be given to another. Refund exceptions may be made with documentation for academic requirements.

CARD USAGE FEE:

Transactions are subject to a Card Usage Fee equal to 3% of your total purchase, effective July 1, 2024. This fee will be applied to all payments made by credit or debit cards, regardless of where the payment is made—online, in person, or by phone.

PHOTO POLICY:

Orange County Recreation reserves the right to photograph and publish photographs of participants for publicity purposes. Photographs may also be shared with the program instructors.

STAFFING AND SUPERVISION:

All staff members are hired based on a combination of education, knowledge of program/activity, and/or childcare-related experience. Each employee has his or her references validated and undergoes a criminal background check.

All counselors are certified in CPR and First Aid and receive over ten hours of camp-specific training from Expert Online Summer Camp Training and Orange County Recreation Division Management Staff.

Camps for Ages 3-5-years-old..... 1:8

Other Half-day Camps 1:12

PICK-UP AND DROP-OFF PROCEDURES; LUNCH SUPERVISION

PICK-UP AND DROP-OFF TIMES & PROCEDURES

DROP-OFF:

Drop-off for morning camps is 7:30-8 a.m.. Drop-off for afternoon camps is 1:00 p.m.-1:15 p.m. Anyone needing to drop-off a child outside of regular schedule must call 919.245.2667 at arrival for their child to be greeted, checked-in, and escorted to camp by staff.

PICK-UP:

Pick-up for morning camps is 12-12:15 p.m. Pick-up for afternoon camps is 5-5:30 p.m.. Anyone needing to pick-up a child outside of regular schedule must call 919.245.2667 for their child to be escorted from camp by staff and safely dismissed.

Pickup will not be accommodated 11:45 a.m.-12 p.m. and 4:45-5 p.m. to allow for camp transitions—if you need early pick-up, plan to arrive prior to 11:45 a.m. and 4:45 p.m..

KISS & GO:

For the safety and efficiency of drop-off and pick-up, families are strongly encouraged to use Kiss & Go. Participants for Kiss & Go must be dropped off and picked up through Kiss & Go in front of the Central Recreation Center.

Drivers should enter the Central Recreation Center area from the East on Tryon Street. Turn right into the drive in front of the Central Recreation Center. After dropping off or picking up, drivers will exit Kiss & Go onto Hassel Street.

Children should be prepared to exit and enter the right side of the vehicle to allow safe passage into the building without crossing the flow of traffic. Staff will open the car door and greet campers upon arrival, escorting them into their proper camp space. At dismissal, staff will escort campers from the Central Recreation Center to their vehicles, assisting with doors and keeping campers safe around traffic. Drivers are asked to stay in their vehicle for drop-off and pick-up to prevent delays.

Two numbered cards will be provided to each household enrolled in camp. Numbered card must be on display through front windshield during pick-up. These cards are uniquely assigned and authorize pickup of your camper - do not share a card with anyone who does not have permission to pick your child up from camp. These cards are valid and linked to household participants for the full nine-week summer camp season, so keep these cards safe and secure until your camper's summer is concluded.

Individuals picking up a child from camp without a camp-issued card will be asked to show ID and must be on the child's authorized pick-up list.


WALKERS:

For families who cannot use Kiss & Go, parents may walk campers to the rear gymnasium doors of the Central Recreation Center for admission to and dismissal from camp.

Neighborhood families who intend to walk to/from camp must submit the Intent to Walk Form no later than 5pm the Thursday prior to their child's first week of camp (only needs to be submitted once for the summer). Once submitted, campers will be staged at the rear of the facility for dismissal for the remainder of the summer and will not be dismissed through Kiss & Go.

Access the rear of the building via the gravel lot off of Hassel Street. Walkers must be accompanied by an adult and must be greeted and admitted into the facility by a Recreation Division staff member. Anyone picking up a walk-up camper must be at least 16 years of age and will be asked to show an ID or provide the child's pickup password.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

LUNCH SUPERVISION

Only campers enrolled in a full-day of camp (two half-day camps back-to-back) may participate in Lunch Supervision. Lunch Supervision is included in a full day of camp enrollment (morning and afternoon camps combined). Half-day campers may not enroll in Lunch Supervision. Lunch is not provided; campers must bring their own non-perishable meals. Refrigerator and microwave are not available. Campers in half-day camps are also encouraged to bring a snack and water bottle for each camp daily.

A snack vending machine is available at Central Recreation Center.

With an ever-increasing number of peanut allergies among young children, we strongly discourage participants from bringing any “nut-products” to camp.

Campers will eat lunch outside (weather permitting) or in one of the camp classrooms. During the one hour lunch period (12-1 p.m.), campers will rotate between lunch tables, playground, and field or gymnasium play with twenty (20) minutes at each rotation.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Do you offer a full day of camp? Yes, most of our camps are based on a half-day model where parents can select a morning (7:30 a.m.-12 p.m.) and afternoon (1-5:30 p.m.) camp based on their child’s age and interests. Campers registered in both a morning and afternoon camp may participate in Lunch Supervision from 12 to 1 p.m. without any additional cost for a full day of camp care.

Can I have someone else pick up my child from camp? At the time of registration you should provide a list of all individuals authorized to pick up your child, including yourself. Any individual on this list may sign your child out from camp. All authorized pick-up individuals must be at least 16-years-old and bring a photo ID with them to pick-up. All pick-up will be handled via Kiss & Go as explained on page 6.

Where do I take my child on the first day of camp? All camps originate at the Central Recreation Center in downtown Hillsborough. Kiss & Go Drop-off will be available at the front of the Central Recreation Center. Campers who wish to walk in to camp may do so through the rear gymnasium doors. See page 6 for drop-off and pick-up information. Participants should arrive between 7:30 and 8:00 a.m. (or 1:00 and 1:15 p.m. if enrolled in only an afternoon camp) to be checked-in and escorted to their camp room.

May I register my child for camp outside his/her age level? Program content is designed to be appropriate for a specific age group. An attempt is made to stay faithful to the age level so that campers do not have an unhappy time with activities that are not designed for their developmental level.



Do the children have a break? Yes. There is a snack break built into all camps in both the morning and the afternoon. Campers are asked to bring a snack for each camp in which they are enrolled and a refillable water bottle with their name on it. Campers with us for a full day are also asked to bring a bagged lunch. Refrigeration and use of microwave are not available.

Who are the counselors? All of our counselors have experience working with children. They are certified in CPR and First Aid and receive ten hours of camp-specific training from Expert Online Summer Camp Training and Orange County Recreation Division Management Staff.

What do campers do during inclement weather? In the event of rain/lightning or when Orange County issues a Code Red or above, campers in outdoor activities on-site at the Central Recreation Center will be moved into the gymnasium or their assigned activity area. Field trip camps will handle inclement weather on a case-by-case basis while ensuring camper safety.

How is camper medication handled at camp? The Consent for Medication form located on our website outlines all medication policies and procedures. Completing and submitting this form provides staff with the necessary information to assist your child with their medical needs.



The Counselor In Training Program is designed to train youths ages 13-15-years-old to assist Summer Camp staff with implementing camps for campers ages 3-11-years-old. C.I.T. is an educational program that exposes those enrolled to the responsibilities of being a Camp Counselor.

The C.I.T. program provides opportunities to build leadership, teamwork, customer service, programming, and supervisory skills while providing on-site staff support. Participants will gain basic work experience as a valuable enhancement to college applications, résumés, and future employment.

If you are chosen to be a C.I.T., it means you are neither a traditional camper nor a staff member. This can be a difficult situation. If and when you were a camper, you were a recipient of camp. The entire staff collaborated to construct a great camp experience. All those wonderful things that seem to happen only at camp were done for you. As a C.I.T., you will have the opportunity and the responsibility to assist in making those wonderful experiences for others.

To be part of the C.I.T. program takes commitment and maturity. This program has demands but it also has many rewards. The entire summer camp staff will be there to help and guide you, but you need to be a mature young adult ready to both lead and take constructive feedback.

While we strive to provide an excellent C.I.T. experience, we recognize the reality that not everyone who participates will qualify for future employment. From the many applications we receive each year, we are very selective about who we hire – a reason so many parents entrust us with their children.
