



### Flash Flooding Likely and Scattered Wind Damage Expected Across Central NC

Remnants of Michael are expected to move quickly NE across central NC today and will exit the area Thursday evening. The main threat from this storm will be heavy rain and strong wind gusts. The greatest impacts are expected to occur across Central NC between noon and 6 pm.

### Key Points

- Michael will be faster moving than Florence, so while we are expecting flooding, it should be less widespread than we experienced with Florence.
- Periods of heavy downpours are expected through this evening. Widespread rainfall amounts of 3 to 6 inches can be expected. Rainfall amounts of this amount will result in flash flooding of low-lying, urban and poor drainage area.
- Sustained winds of 20 to 30 mph can be expected, with gusts up to 40 to 50 mph, highest across southeastern NC, but also the northwest Piedmont. Winds of this magnitude will result in scattered downed trees and power outages.



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
